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#### PARTNER INSTITUTE'S ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES



This document lists out the Roles and Responsibilities of Techno International Newtown (Formerly known as Techno India College of Technology) hereinafter referred to as the "Partner Institute" concerning both the WE course curriculum.

The Roles and Responsibilities that the Partner Institute has to adhere to for ensuring the success of the NEN Program ("Program") are as follows:

- 1. Fully adopt the Program and its associated curriculum in the following manner:
  - Permit students to form and run Practice Venture (PV) in groups of 2-5 as "real-venture" with financial transactions and profit motives. PV form the cornerstone of NEN's offering and is a requirement to deliver the course.
  - Should have published the information about offering of Wadhwani courses on their website/brochures/fliers/courses offered list on the noticeboard, before a faculty is approved for NEN training.
  - 100% of the WE NEN courses' content and related assessments shall be delivered via LearnWISE.
- 2. Strong evangelist faculty member(s) appointed, trained and NEN certified to run course(s):
  - The faculty member should either be a senior or junior faculty, Teaching Assistant (TA), or alumni who have experience in teaching.
  - The faculty member(s) trained by NEN should have deep knowledge and skill in entrepreneurship building and other subjects related to it.
  - If such faculty is not available or does not qualify, a Partner Institute funded visiting or adjunct faculty appointed for this purpose shall be provided.
  - To be able to disseminate the WE NEN curricula, the faculty is required to clear the online and face to face tests that are conducted by NEN. If the program rollout is delayed or canceled due to the inability of the faculty to clear the tests conducted by NEN, the Partner Institute shall not hold NEN liable.





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- It is the responsibility of the Partner Institute to conform to all requisites to facilitate faculty training and registration by NEN on LearnWISE. This training will be at the charge of a nominal registration fee. Such fee may either be funded:
  - By the Partner Institute;
  - By NEN, provided the Partner Institute ensures the cost of accommodation and logistics of NEN trainers; or
  - A conglomerate of institutes enrolled from the same region as Partner Institute, which decides to take the NEN trainer's training together.
- The classes may also be LIVE and run remotely by the WE NEN master trainer in specific schedules catering to multiple colleges at a time (1:N model).
- The Partner Institute shall provide for the necessary infrastructure required to run the Program:
  - At least 10 Mbps of dedicated wired internet connection in the classroom,
  - Dedicated classroom (preferably smart) with cluster seating or a classroom seating arrangement,
  - 2 dedicated laptops for main projection, plus one laptop for each student/student group,
  - Projector,
  - Speakers 3 JBL extreme or similar,
  - 3 cordless Mic or mixer,
  - Camera Logitech HD pro webcam 2 nos., for complete classroom view, and
  - Power back-up.
- Engage students in classroom activities as necessary to learn effectively which shall be measured through students' scores in assessments.
- Keep NEN apprised of the students that are showing a strong inclination and aptitude towards start-up regularly.
- Mentoring support for students' PVs which is a mandatory capstone project.
- 3. Adopt WE NEN's built-in assessments as a mandatory part of overall course assessments including the quizzes, assignments, and capstone/PV project with a weightage of 100% for final credits of the program. Additionally, NEN may provide for a paper-based assessment if the Partner Institute requires to have the assessments on paper.
- 4. Campus management and leaders, for this Program, will work to apprise all relevant stakeholders within the institute about the key terms of the Program so that there is adequate and timely support to the faculty within their departments and their institutes.



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- 5. Management, other relevant leaders and faculty members should have an open communication channel with the NEN regional managers and regional head to facilitate problem-solving and support for the smooth running of the Program.
- 6. The Partner Institute shall facilitate students to meet real-life entrepreneurs, arrange field visits for the students to successful startups in similar space as their own PVs.
- 7. Partner Institute shall nominate a Coordinator, from faculty or otherwise, who would coordinate with NEN and will be responsible for all the things related to running the course smoothly for this Program. He/She shall be the main point of contact (POC) for NEN related to every activity concerning this Program.
- 8. The Partner Institute shall facilitate students to meet real-life entrepreneurs, arrange field visits for the students to successful startups in similar space as their own PVs.
- 9. Partner Institute will not copy or reproduce in any form, NEN's intellectual property.
- 10. Partner shall provide NEN with all required support to track the progress of the Program.
- 11. The Partner Institute shall not be permitted to charge any fees to the students, for granting to them access to and use of, LearnWISE. However, notwithstanding the foregoing, the Partner Institute may recover, by way of fees or other charges, from the students, the costs and expenses incurred by it in making LearnWISE available to such students, such as the costs incurred in relation to faculty, the IT infrastructure, etc.

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

Entrepreneurship is not a destination; it's a journey. On this journey, successful entrepreneurs don't have an expectation of "arriving" to some finish line. If you do have that expectation, you won't continue to push yourself to step outside of your comfort and grow. You won't seek out the things that truly help your business experience explosive results because all those things require you stretching yourself. On any journey, you have times of joy and more than a few setbacks. During the times of joy, you feel like you can accomplish anything. It gives you the strength and motivation to continue to put in the work that helps your business. During the hard times, negative feelings and emotions can easily take over. Before you know it, you're feeling sorry for yourself and you turn to your familiar coping mechanism. To support new start up IIT kharagpur provide a platform from where we can get financial support for our project PRISM is for budding students, professionals and common citizens interested in



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innovation and having an implementable and commercially viable, novel innovation. Entrepreneurs need to follow some basic principles which would serve as guidelines and beacons for their success. Based on the research conducted over a period of three years and by interviewing more than 150 entrepreneurs, noted author and management expert, Bill Murphy came out with a book about entrepreneurship which was published by Harvard Business School. This article is based on the insights from this book and lists five principles that should serve as markers for both aspiring as well as existing entrepreneurs. One of the insights from this research is that most of these principles can be learned from experience and the process of starting a venture is an educational experience in itself. With this introduction,



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we can now move on to the five principles of entrepreneurship as put forward by Bill Murphy.

## It is always not the case that Entrepreneurs should make money fast and this should not be the goal

It is important for entrepreneurs to test the waters before launching a new venture. This means that one must commit oneself to the ideal of entrepreneurship and try out new business models, and new forms and paradigms of transacting business. In other words, the entrepreneurs must not be in a hurry to make profits from the word go and instead, understand what entrepreneurship is all about. For instance, it is better to come up with a game changing idea instead of pursuing leads that are dead ends which means that entrepreneurs must be ready to be in the game for the long haul.

## It is always better to find the right opportunity even if it takes time instead of chasing mirages

This principle translates into waiting for the right opportunity and at the same time, seizing the moment when the opportunity arises. Of course, we are not saying that entrepreneurs ought to wait forever for the right opportunity. Rather, the intention here is that entrepreneurs must ensure that they have the necessary foundation in place to capitalize on the opportunity and also must have an idea and a business model that would create opportunities in case they are finding it difficult to get the venture going. For instance, as the clichés about how opportunity knocks only once as well as if you do not find an opportunity, build a door so that you are ready when the opportunity arises can be taken to mean that entrepreneurs must both create opportunities as well as seize them when they arise. Another analogy would be that entrepreneurs must be ready with the fishing rods and the baits when they go fishing and that they must create new markets for themselves.

### Invest in people and build successful teams

As with the previous principle, entrepreneurs must ensure that they have the right team in place before they start the venture. After all, unless there is a team in place, the venture would not be able to capitalize on the opportunities. Further, entrepreneurs must ensure that the team is passionate, committed, and most importantly, shares the vision and mission of the founders. In other words, unless there is a buy-in from the team with the founder's ideas, the venture would flounder. Apart from these, getting the right people who have focus, drive, loyalty, determination, courage, and consistency in addition to being motivated and creative are some requirements that the entrepreneurs can ill afford to ignore.

## It is always not enough to have everything in place. Execution and Delivery are what matters

Have you ever got the feeling that a salesperson is engaging you in glib talk wherein he or she is trying to convince you to buy a product which is untested? Similarly, all talk and no execution would lead the new venture nowhere and hence, it is important for entrepreneurs to ensure that they walk the talk and deliver on their promises.

Indeed, it is not enough to have a game changing idea and a great team in place unless the entrepreneur knows the art of execution. As happened during the Dotcom boom, there were many startups with great ideas and equally great teams that promised the moon for anyone



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willing to listen. However, the fact that they failed in their businesses was mainly due to the gap between ideas and execution.

Therefore, the entrepreneur has to be a leader who walks the talk and understands the meaning of execution. Further, leadership means that entrepreneurs must not be afraid of failure and must instead, turn adversity into triumph and transform failure into a stepping stone for success.

Indeed, great entrepreneurs are those who are willing to trust their instincts and intuition and back themselves up when the venture is yet to fructify or even making losses. In other words, if you think that you have a great idea and are executing it well with the right team, you need to persist and keep going even when the conventional wisdom says that you are getting it wrong.

### Entrepreneurs must be self actualizing visionaries

Ask any successful entrepreneur and they would say that while money is indeed important and profits are indeed essential, it is always not about the money or that making profits is the only thing that matters. Instead, great entrepreneurship is all about heeding the inner voice, creating jobs and opportunities for others, be conscious of societal prosperity due to the venture instead of having a me, myself only attitude, and most importantly, translate their vision into success.

For instance, there are many of us who have heard or come across individuals who gave up cushy jobs to find their passions and to follow and chase their dreams. Therefore, successful entrepreneurship is all about making a difference to the world and becoming a social messiah who would transform societies with his or her ventures.

#### CONCLUSION

Finally, entrepreneurship must be seen as a starting point to transform oneself and in the process become a change agent. For this to happen, the entrepreneur must be both be able to fulfill environmental, social, and economic expectations from the larger system and at the same time, must drive themselves in the pursuit of their dreams. Indeed, the balance between inner aspirations and external expectations is the most important determinant for success.
