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#### **Discussion / Decision taken**

#### Welcome Address by the Chair:

The Chair welcomed the members of the House present in the Meeting.

#### Agenda 1: Review of 18th IQAC meeting

1.1. A thorough review of the last MOM was done in the house. The house agreed unanimously to the institute Vision that is modified by incorporating all the suggestions of the previous meeting that was held on 23.05.22. The finalized institute Vision is as follows:

"To achieve excellence in transformative education inculcating research, innovation and entrepreneurship skills that will create good leaders and innovators for sustainable growth of technology, economy and society."

- **1.2** The house agreed unanimously to the institute Mission that is stated as follows:
- To create a holistic ambience where state-of-the-art research, new ideas, innovation and leadership are encouraged
- To develop new knowledge and foster talent for identifying and addressing the problems faced by the industry, society and the nation
- To facilitate innovation and entrepreneurship for creation and enhancement of employability with the skills imparted and the knowledge generated
- To encourage collaborative and inter-disciplinary research in partnership with the industry and other academic institutions with the aim of instilling an urge for lifelong learning in the students
- **1.3** A rough draft of the institute short term goals are placed before the house as follows:



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- 1. **Fostering Entrepreneurship:** To encourage entrepreneurial attitude among students and foster start-ups through education, research and training aimed at sustainable economic growth
- 2. **Promote Research and Innovation:** To create a supportive environment for innovation and scholarship that nurtures the talent and skills which can offer viable solutions to societal problems
- 3. **Extensive Collaboration with the Industry:** Bridging the Industry-Academia gap by adopting cutting-edge technology beyond the curriculum through extensive involvement with the industry and other institutes of higher education
- 4. **Encourage Interdisciplinary in Education:** To promote an interdisciplinary academic culture with the aim to establish new centres of study for designing solutions with critical thinking and collaborative guidance
- 5. **Instilling Social Responsibilities and Ethics:** To advocate commitment to ethical values and social responsibilities through extension activities, with the purpose of being in service to the nation
- Sustainable Ecosystem: Striving for a cleaner and greener campus where healthy learning and holistic development are encouraged.
   The house suggested removal of the sixth point while keeping the remaining intact in the list of long term goals mentioned above.
- 1.4 A rough draft of the institute long term goals are placed before the house as follows:
- 1. To achieve autonomy in education by becoming an independent self-governing Institution pursuing innovation and excellence through good governance and academic empowerment
- 2. To broaden educational base and encourage diversity in entrepreneurship for creating opportunities of employment and addressing societal problems
- 3. To nurture an eco-system of research and innovation conducive to the emergence of future leaders and entrepreneurs.

The house agreed unanimously to all the points but suggested removal of the third point in the list of long term goals mentioned above.

1.5 It is decided that the finalized institute vision, mission, long term and short term goals will be sent to the Board of Governors for ratification.



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#### Agenda 2: Settlement of 1 no. of distinctiveness of TINT

The house finalized one distinctive feature of the institute that will be sent the Board of Governors for ratification.

The house finalized two distinctive features of the institute that will be sent the Board of Governors for ratification.

#### Agenda 4: Incorporation of Training & Placement Officer in IQAC

- 4.1 It is proposed by the IQAC coordinator to incorporate Training & Placement Officer, TINT,Mr. Soumya Kanti Das. All the members present in the house agreed to the proposal.
- 4.2 Mr. Das is briefed of all the IQAC activities by the IQAC coordinator. He is also informed that henceforth onwards, all the student trainings must be approved by IQAC. The departmental HODs may propose the T & P officer to arrange specialized trainings for the students to enhance their skills. Such trainings must be ratified by IQAC before they are placed before the Institute Director.

# Agenda 5: Identification of the thrust areas of different disciplines for the students training to make them industry ready

- 5.1 It is proposed by Dr. M. Basu that it is possible to reduce the industry-academia gap by conducting workshops in cutting edge technology beyond the prescribed curriculum. He also suggested that all final year projects should lead to journal, conference publications.
- 5.2 The house agreed unanimously that all B. Tech projects may be started from 6th semester onwards to increase project duration. The house also agreed that all projects should either go towards research publications or product development.
- 5.3 It is also agreed that all departments should encourage interdisciplinary projects. This may be achieved by either collaborating with other departments of TINT or with other institutions.

The meeting ended with thanks to the Chair.
